Dear Friends,

Eastertide – A Forgotten Celebration - I do not know if you are aware, but some clergy get a bit cross about Advent and Christmas not being kept properly! Advent, the few weeks before Christmas, as you will know, are supposed to be the quiet and thoughtful preparation for the Christmas celebration. Advent is officially a 'penitential season' a time to reflect on what could be better in our lives. What happens these days is we begin to celebrate Christmas with decorations and carol services quite early on in Advent. This does muddle up the liturgical sense of things. Then after Boxing Day, Christmas is almost over... but it has only just started! The Twelve Days of Christmas starting at Midnight on Christmas Eve ushers in 12 days of celebration of the birth of Christ. Anyway, what has this to do with Eastertide? And why is the Vicar talking about Easter which was a month ago?!



Just as the real Advent and Christmas 'time-line' has been forgotten or ignored so to with Easter. Lent holds a similar function to Advent, a penitential season of preparation. We are a bit better at keeping Lent, we may even have given something up, or joined in a Lent course or Bible study. When we get to Easter Day, we tend to think of it as a great feast but that it is a 'one day' event. After 40 days of fasting in Lent, Easter Day ushers in 50 days of celebration! Here at Bray, we do keep Eastertide, we are still singing the Easter hymns and we follow the Lectionary readings which are preparing us for Ascension and Pentecost. The resurrection of Jesus and his ascension prepare us for the coming of the Holy Spirit which brings in the new age of Christ being present everywhere and within each of us.

I do not get cross about a poor keeping of Advent and Christmas or Lent and Eastertide but I do feel we are missing out if we don't have a full sense of the seasons of the Church, which for nearly 2000 years have been the way Christians have prepared and celebrated the key moments of our faith. I know it's 'counter cultural' but let us keep the feast!
