The inclusion of some of the songs and music that meant so much to Sir Michael gave an extra dimension to the compelling presentation. Songs included Summertime - Gershwin, The Long and Winding Road – The Beatles, Moon River – Jonny Mercer, The Way you look tonight (dedicated to Mary Parkinson) Tony Bennet, and As Time Goes By – Wilson.



Nearly eight years ago I had a call from God to become an ordained minister in the Church of England. It was on an ordinary Sunday morning in the church I was leading as an enthusiastic volunteer and I had gone to another service earlier in the day and taken bread and wine to be blessed by a priest which I could then distribute later... communion by extension.

The journey has taken a long time, and involved a lot of changes. I have been here at St Michael's for four of those years, I have spent three years at theological college in the evenings and some weekends, I have finally left software engineering (though I do keep a bit of a hand in it). Last year I was ordained a deacon, allowing me to wear the dog-collar and be known as Reverend Andy Medlicott. A few weeks ago I was ordained a Priest, in addition to being a deacon, by Bishop Mary as she anointed my hands.



This is a very significant milestone; my call started with communion by extension, and now I am able to consecrate the bread and wine. Of course my journey continues - we never stop learning.

It is my belief that the Christian journey is really only possible through being part of a community. I am conscious that in these eight years I have met and journeyed with many people. Of course Jesus is absolutely central, but also included are my wife (who is also a priest) and daughter, lecturers and fellow students at college, those from my sending church of Warfield, and of course many people at St Michael's, the village and the wider parish!

So on that hot Saturday morning it was wonderful to be surrounded by people who have journeyed with me, and will continue to do so! Thank you everyone.

However, somehow here I was at a very warm Windsor Racecourse, surrounded by hundreds of pink clad beings, adorned with wings and head boppers, energetically punching the air whilst leaping to the sound of the beat of the music. After this sudden burst of activity, I was ready for a sit down and a cup of tea. How wrong can you be! This was just the preamble to the start of my 5K run!

Cautiously, Elaine and I joined the end of the 'joggers' queue and quickly found our companions were out for a leisurely stroll! Not having signed up for that, we determinedly meandered through the crowd till we could comfortably start jogging, albeit at a very steady pace! It got to about the 3k stage when it suddenly dawned on us that what we thought in practice was 5k, the actual distance was considerably longer! That last 2k was hard going!

"We've just overtaken someone" gasped Elaine as we passed another competitor with a cheery wave and a congratulatory "You're doing well". What she failed to mention was that the person was probably either on crutches or in a wheel chair! No chance of cheating as one of the Marshalls was Katrin who had her phone on hand to film us at various stages of exhaustion!

What seemed like hours when in fact was about 45 minutes later, we joined hands to pull each other over that very welcome finishing line! I think we must have been some of the more senior joggers that day, because they mentioned our names as we surged forward to collect our medals and a drink of much needed water!

Why put myself through this? As most of you know I had Stage 3 breast cancer diagnosed in 2023 and it's only because of the medical advancements that I am still here. So, I decided when I was well enough, I would fund raise for Cancer Research UK. With the very generous support from my friends at St Michaels, I have raised £1185.
