Hugo Vickers – Wednesday 9th October at 7.30 in St Michaels

Renowned as a Royal Biographer, Hugo has chosen "Q2 to K3" (Queen 2 to King 3 – the Monarchy in Transition) as the title for his talk. He will take us through the last few years of the reign of Queen Elizabeth II as she moved to Windsor Castle before lockdown in 2020, the death of Prince Philip, the remarkable Platinum Jubilee, and then The Queen's death and State Funeral.

He will talk of the new reign and the Coronation, and examine how the new King is tackling his role as Head of State - and bring us right up to date with the challenges, the issues, and the future of the British Monarchy in 2024.

Hugo Vickers has commentated on many royal events as well as writing biographies including on Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother and, more recently, HRH The Duke of Kent.

Curate Andy Medlicott Stepping out of the boat...


Many years ago I encountered the phrase *"if you want to walk on water, you need to step out of the boat"* - it's one of those phrases that still influences me. It refers to Peter's risky stepping out of the boat for a *(brief)* water walking episode recorded in Matthew 14:22-33. When I have risked, I have grown - though not always in the way I expected!

As a card-carrying introvert can you imagine my emotions when asked to do a series of radio interviews exploring my journey from becoming a deacon, to (God willing) also being ordained a priest next year? It's one thing to speak in church to people you know, it's another thing to be interviewed and have no clue who will be listening! But, how could I refuse? If I shy away from a risk, a challenge, how can I encourage others to also take risks? Thankfully they are recorded, not live!

As is often the case, it's never as bad as I fear... the interviewers were skilled in putting me at ease and ensuring the conversation flowed. The latest interviewer asked me what I was most proud of doing as a curate - and it reminded me of being part of a recent wedding and having the honour of praying for the couple. I was reminded of the joy I have in ministry! That reminder's been such an encouragement as this week I've been facing the reality of continuing academic study as a curate! If I'd not risked going out of my comfort zone, I'd have had a much harder week. I've also had friends who I've not spoken to in ages drop me a note to say they heard me on the radio! And of course my hope and prayer is that others hearing my words are also inspired and encouraged.

May we continue to step out of our boats and discover what God wants to show us!
